Curriculum Overview

Our website provides a more detailed overview of what each class is learning about each term but here is a brief overview.

Reception

Reception children have been busy learning all about themselves and their peers, making friends and building positive bonds. We have now started our Autumn themed term learning about the different seasons and creating beautiful art work with leaves and natural resources. reading 'The Little Red Hen' in literacy which is a folk tale abo We are reading 'The Little Red Hen' in literacy which is a folk tale about friend-ship and sharing, the children have loved getting into the character roles. Our weeks ahead have lots of fun activities including Halloween crafting and cooking.

<u>Year 1</u>

In Year 1 we are learning to write simple sentences independently and to add numbers to 10. In Geography we are learning all about our school grounds and local area, and finally in science we are learning all about our bodies and how amazing they are.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a busy few weeks settling into year 2. We are confident now with our rules, routines and expectations. In maths we have explored numbers to 100 and we are about to begin exploring addition and subtrac-tion. We are exploring letter writing in English and various other genres. Science has seen us learning about humans and other animals. Our history focus is significant individuals. Lots more fun and exciting lessons are to follow before we break up for half term!

<u>Year 3</u>

In Year 3 this term, we shall be focusing on numbers to 1000, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division in Maths. We are exploring narratives, playscripts and informational and instructional texts in English. We shall be learning about The Stone Age and Iron Age in History, North Amer-ica in Geography and animals, including humans and rocks in Science. Pupils will get the opportunity to develop their gymnastics and multi-sports skills in P.E. and also how to see like an artist by using techniques such as shading and using shapes to help them improve their work. We have a busy term ahead of us!

<u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 have hit the ground running and have been working hard on place value in maths and dilemmas in English. We have been learning all about the Romans ready for our trip to Chester too. In PE we have been working on our hockey and gymnastics skills.

<u>Year 5</u>

In Year 5, we have been learning all about Greece in our geography lessons which we are able to link to our English topic of Myths and Legends. We have been looking closely at the myth 'Prometheus and Pandora' and doing lots of writing about the different characters. We have been delving further into this in our reading lessons, looking at a range of myths. In maths, we have finished our place value unit and we are now moving on to addition and subtraction. In Science, we have been fortunate to visit OBA where we have been learning all about states of matter and in school we have been learning all about life cycles.

<u>Year 6</u>

This term we will be learning about our local area and how we fit in the wider world. We will use maps and ordinance to develop skills. I'm art we will be creating photo montages and explore effects of colour, shape and size. Later in the term Year 6 will be investigating how Liverpool became a city and how our region changed during the Industrial Revolution. I'm Science, we have been learning about the heart and circulatory system. In English we will be writing narratives and explore new grammar and punctuation. In maths we will be developing our skills and fluency in a range of number and calculation topics.
